Light the Night on Main will occur on certain portions of Main Street on Wednesday, December 2, 2015 between the hours of 6:00 P.M. and 8:00 P.M. The event will cause some street closures and parking restrictions.

Street Closing/Restrictions:

Main Street from 10th Street to 15th Street will be closed for all but emergency traffic and event participants beginning at 4:30 P.M. on December 2, 2015. Main Street will reopen in the area of the closure at the end of the event.

Gilman Street and Allison Way will be closed for all but emergency traffic and event participants beginning at 4:30 P.M. on December 2, 2015. Gilman Street and Allison Way will reopen in the area of the closure at the end of the event.

Ford Street from 10th Street to Main Street will be closed for all but emergency traffic and event participants beginning at 4:30 P.M. on December 2, 2015. Ford Street will reopen in the area of the closure at the end of the event. Patients and employees of the Community-Westview building will still be able to access the facility from the intersection of 10th Street and Ford Street during the closure.

Parking Restrictions:

Temporary "No Parking" signs will be posted on Main Street for both the east and west sides of the street between 10th Street and 15th Street on Wednesday, December 2, 2015, at approximately 8 A.M. Although the signs will be posted by 8 A.M. that day, parking enforcement will not begin until 3 P.M. Wednesday, December 2, 2015. After 3 P.M., any vehicle parked on Main Street between 10th and 15th Street will be towed at the owner's expense by the Speedway Police Department.

The area of the closure on Ford Street, Gilman Street, and Main Street is posted with permanent “No Parking” signs. This area will be monitored and any vehicles parked in violation will be towed at the owner’s expense by the Speedway Police Department.
