RESOLUTION NO. 2013-07

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A PILOT RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT PROGRAM IN THE OLD SPEEDWAY CITY NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION FOR 2013 AND RELATED MATTERS

WHEREAS, the Town Council (the "Town Council") of the Town of Speedway, Indiana (the "Town") desires to provide uniform access to parking in the Town; and

WHEREAS, the residents of the Town have a reasonable expectation that onstreet parking will be available for their use on a regular basis, both during non-racing and racing events; and

WHEREAS, the Town desires to improve curb appeal, cleanliness and overall image not only during race times, but year around and the placement of barricades and other devices to block off or reserve parking spaces on public thoroughfares creates an unsafe and unsightly presence in neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, the reasons to undertake this initiative, include, but are not limited to better access to parking, increased safety, community and neighborhood pride, cleanliness, and quality of life are primary opportunities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SPEEDWAY, INDIANA, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Town will work cooperatively with the Old Speedway City Neighborhood Association (the "OSCNA") to implement from May 17, 2013 through September 30, 2013 a pilot residential permit parking program (the "Pilot Program") in an area contained in the geographical boundaries of the OSCNA, which is Tenth Street on the south, Sixteenth Street on the north, Lynhurst Drive on the west and Main Street on the east.
- 2. The Program will be created and implemented consistent with Ordinance 1214, adopted by the Town Council on March 25, 2013.
- 3. A technical committee will be created through the Neighborhood Pride Implementation Team and the OSCNA to identify and resolve issues and determine the final days and dates for which the Trial Program will be in effect.
- 4. Residents of the permit area will be required to display their permit when parked on streets in the parking permit area during the Trial Program.
- 5. During the Pilot Program, residents are to refrain from placement of any device, barricade or other item used for the express purpose of blocking access to parking or parking spaces on any street within the Trial Program area. Any such devices or materials will be removed by the Street Department, which has been authorized to

remove barricades and other devices placed on public streets within the permit area during the Pilot Program, as allowed by local, county and state law.

6. This resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
