A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SPEEDWAY, INDIANA APPROVING AN ENGINEERING CONTRACT WITH COMMONWEALTH ENGINEERING, INC. FOR WORK RELATED TO ASSESSMENT OF AND IMPLEMENTATION OF ANY ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS RELATED TO IDEM RULES ON INTERNAL COMBUSTION ENGINES USED BY THE TOWN OF SPEEDWAY

WHEREAS, the Town of Speedway, Indiana (the "Town") has heretofore established, constructed and financed a municipal sanitary sewer works and other departments for the benefit and provision of services to the Town's residents; and

WHEREAS, the Town has determined that technical assistance is required to determine the regulatory and operational impact of rules being developed by the Indiana Department of Environmental Management; and

WHEREAS, Commonwealth Engineering, Inc. has the expertise to provide these services.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SPEEDWAY, INDIANA:

- 1. The Council approves a contract in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$11,000 as outlined in "Attachment A" hereto payable from funds through the Sanitation Operating account.
- 2. The Council authorizes the Town Manager to execute the Amendment to the contract and take the administrative steps necessary to approve the contract.





Municipality and Drinking Water/Waste Water Stationary Internal Combustion Engines Initiative

Dear Indiana Municipality or Drinking Water/Waste Water Operator:

Do you operate stationary internal combustion engines (e.g. generators, pumps, blower engines)? The Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) has become aware that entities like you may operate stationary internal combustion engines that are subject to Indiana's air permitting requirements, and federal regulations such as the Reciprocating Internal Combustion Engine (RICE) National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP).

You need to determine if your engines require an air permit

Air permitting requirements can apply to stationary internal combustion engines as small as seventy-four (74) horsepower for diesel-fired engines, about 100 horsepower for gasoline-fired engines, or about 0.5 million Btu/hr (fuel input) for natural gas-fired engines. These thresholds indicate a permit is needed, whether the threshold is equaled or exceeded by a single engine or the total combined horsepower or fuel input of multiple engines. To begin to determine whether you need a permit, you must identify all of your stationary internal combustion engines, their power ratings/capacities, and the dates the engines were constructed/installed. You also must determine whether each engine has ever been used for non-emergency purposes, or contracted to operate as part of a peak shaving program, or other program where you received benefits, such as reduced utility rates for the availability to operate the engine, whether the engine was actually operated or not. If your engines require a permit and you participate in this initiative as specified in the Limited Liability section below. IDEM will work with you to help you obtain the proper permit and minimize penalties for certain air permit violations discovered as a part of this initiative as long as compliance is achieved and all necessary permit applications are submitted to IDEM no later than September 30, 2013.

Calculating air emissions from stationary internal combustion engines

The level of air permit required is based upon the engine's potential to emit air pollution. Please see Appendix A for helpful examples on how to do these calculations. If you need help, please contact IDEM's Compliance and Technical Assistance Program at (800) 988-7901, ctap@idem.in.gov, or visit http://www.in.gov/idem/ctap/2328.htm.

Before submitting an air permit application involving multiple engines

If you have a stationary internal combustion engine at more than one location, please contact Melissa Cline at (317) 234-5132 and request a pre-application meeting to discuss your situation considering those multiple locations. Engines at multiple locations may

require multiple applications and permits. Information you need to provide about engines at multiple locations to help with that determination includes:

- Are the engines located on the same property or contiguous properties?
- If on separate properties, what is the shortest distance between each of the properties?
- A description of any physical connection between the sources such as a pipeline or private road.
- A listing of any employees common to both sources such as administrative staff, production staff, repair staff, security, or managers. For each type of employee, how often do they travel between the sources?
- Is the production process split in any way between the sources? Does one serve as a backup or bypass for the other?
- Are any materials transferred between the sources? If so, for each material how
 often is it transferred and how is it transferred?

Reciprocating Internal Combustion Engine (RICE) NESHAP

RICE NESHAP requirements apply even if you do <u>not</u> need an air permit. Some RICE requirements apply to you unless you are an area source of hazardous air pollutants (HAP) and your only stationary internal combustion engines are located at institutional establishments such as police and fire stations, correctional facilities, and libraries, and construction of the engines commenced before June 12, 2006.

Information you need to help determine what RICE NESHAP Requirements apply Please see Appendix B for helpful information about the RICE NESHAP. For each engine, you need the power rating/capacity, the date the engine was constructed/installed, and whether the engine is compression ignition or spark ignition. For spark ignition engines, is the engine two stroke, four stroke lean burn, four stroke rich burn, does it combust landfill gas/digester gas? Are you an area source or a major source (see Appendix B) of hazardous air pollutants? Is the engine an emergency engine or non-emergency engine under the RICE NESHAP, which uses different criteria for emergency/non-emergency use than for permitting determinations? Please read Appendix B. If you need help, please contact IDEM's Compliance and Technical Assistance Program at (800) 988-7901, ctap@idem.in.gov, or visit http://www.in.gov/idem/ctap/2328.htm.

Limited Liability

To participate in this initiative, you must complete the "Notification" enclosed with this letter and return it to IDEM's OAQ by <u>June 28, 2013</u> at the address provided on the Notification. You must submit all necessary permit applications to IDEM no later than September 30, 2013. As part of the Municipality and Drinking Water/Waste Water Stationary Internal Combustion Engines Initiative, IDEM will limit the monetary fines assessed to participants which have been operating in violation of existing laws. This is referred to as Limited Liability. For the purposes of the Municipality and Drinking Water/Waste Water Stationary Internal Combustion Engines Initiative, Limited Liability means: Any municipality or drinking water/waste water operator that has been operating stationary internal combustion engines without the required permit and voluntarily applies for the required air permit during this time, will be assessed the following reduced civil penalties:

- For municipally owned and operated sources requiring a Title V permit or a Federally Enforceable State Operating Permit, the civil penalty will be reduced by 90%, and will not exceed a total of \$1,125.
- For privately owned <u>or</u> operated drinking and waste water facilities requiring a Title V permit or a Federally Enforceable State Operating Permit, the civil penalty will be reduced by 75%, and will not exceed a total of \$2,800.
- For operations requiring a Minor Source Operating Permit or Source Specific
 Operating Agreement (SSOA), no civil penalties will be assessed provided that
 actual emissions of any criteria pollutant are less than 25 tons per year. The
 source will receive only a Violation Letter. If actual emissions exceed 25 tons per
 year, any civil penalty will be reduced as noted above.
- For operations requiring a Registration or which qualify for Permit-by-Rule, no civil penalties will be assessed. The source will receive only a Violation Letter.

Please note that the civil penalties listed above are a onetime offer only as part of this Limited Liability Initiative. This offer does not extend to any operation which is not a municipality or a drinking water/waste water operator, or that is found in violation of air permit regulations by an IDEM inspection or other IDEM compliance activity (for example: a complaint investigation).

In order to arrive at the total billing rate, the above direct payroll rates shall be multiplied by factors of 40% and 96.4286% to account for payroll and general overhead costs respectively. In addition, a 15% profit level is then added to arrive at total labor costs. This is a total multiplier factor of 3.1625 times direct payroll rates.

Reimbursable Expenses

- 1. Travel from the office shall be at the then currently approved rate by the U.S. Internal Revenue Service plus 15% profit
- 2. Actual cost, plus 15% profit, of subsistence and lodging.
