## 2018 BRICKYARD 400 GENERAL PARKING RESTRICTIONS

The Speedway Police Department reminds local residents and motorists of restricted parking on practice and qualification days and on race day, Sunday, September 9, 2018, for the Brickyard 400.

Practice and qualifications are scheduled for Friday, September 7; and Saturday, September 8; with the Lilly Diabetes 250 Race scheduled for Saturday, September 8; and the Brickyard 400 scheduled to be run on Sunday, September 9, 2018.

No parking will be allowed during certain times on practice and qualification days and on race day for the Brickyard 400 on the South and East sides of designated streets. No person shall park a vehicle on the South and East side of any street in an area bound by 25<sup>th</sup> Street on the North, Georgetown Road on the East, Lynhurst Drive on the West, and Crawfordsville Road on the South, from 6:00 PM Thursday, September 6, through 8:00 PM Sunday, September 9. In the event the race is postponed the restrictions will be in effect until 8:00 PM on Monday, September 10, 2018.

Also, additional restricted parking enacted under Section 10.12.190 of the Speedway Municipal Code for practice and qualification days and for race day for the Brickyard 400 from 6:00 PM Thursday, September 6, through 8:00 PM Sunday, September 9, (or through 8:00 PM Monday, September 10, if race is postponed) includes no parking as follows:

- (1) On both sides of Speedway Dr. from Lynhurst Dr. to Cord St.
- (2) On both sides of N. Auburn St. from 10<sup>th</sup> St. to Speedway Dr.
- (3) On both sides of 25<sup>th</sup> St. from Lynhurst Dr. to Philwood St.
- (4) On both sides of Lynhurst Dr. from 10<sup>th</sup> St. to 26<sup>th</sup> St.
- (5) On both sides of Cord St. from 16<sup>th</sup> St. to Speedway Dr.
- (6) On the south side of Speedway Dr. from Lynhurst Dr. to Cunningham Rd
- (7) On both sides of 20<sup>th</sup> St. from the American Legion parking lot west to Crawfordsville Rd. (S.R.136) and the entire 20<sup>th</sup> St. Court.
- (8) On the west side of Winton Ave. from Crawfordsville Rd. (S.R. 136) to 20<sup>th</sup> St.
- (9) On both sides of Auburn St. from Crawfordsville Rd. (S.R. 136) to 25<sup>th</sup> St.
- (10) On both sides of 22<sup>nd</sup> St. from Lynhurst Dr. to Main St.
- (11) On the west side of Allison St. from 22<sup>nd</sup> St. to Winton Ave.
- (12) On both sides of 16<sup>th</sup> St. from Biltmore St. to Cunningham Rd. and continuing on both sides of Cunningham Rd. to Crawfordsville Rd. (S.R. 136).
- (13) On the north side of Meadowood Dr. from Lynhurst Dr. to Parkwood.
- (14) On both sides of 26<sup>th</sup> St. from Lynhurst Dr. to Moller Rd.

(15) On the east side of Winton Ave. from 16<sup>th</sup> St. to Crawfordsville Rd. (S.R.136).

In addition, no person shall park any vehicle, trailer, recreational vehicle, commercial vehicle or any other utility trailer overnight (between the hours of 9:00 PM and 6:00 AM) on Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights of the NASCAR Race weekend in the following locations:

- (1) In Meadowood Park and on the streets adjacent to Meadowood Park, including the north side of Meadowood Drive, the east side of Parkwood Drive, both sides of School Drive as it borders the east and north sides of Meadowood Park.
- (2) In Leonard Park and on the streets adjacent to Leonard Park, including Town property at the end of Worth, the east side of Worth and the south side of 15<sup>th</sup> Street, as well as the Town Hall Parking lot.
- (3) Along the south side of 14<sup>th</sup> Street west from Winton Avenue to Lynhurst Dr.
- (4) Along the north side of 13<sup>th</sup> Street from Winton Avenue to Allison Street (Junior High West Side Access Drive).

Other streets requiring restricted parking are Main Street between 10<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> Streets and 16<sup>th</sup> Street from Main Street to Lynhurst Drive.

Overnight camping and camping equipment, including tents, trailers, recreational vehicles and their use or parking thereof is not permitted in any playground, park or recreational area unless authorized by the Speedway Board of Recreation. Parking any trailer, recreational vehicle or commercial vehicle at an intersection of a driveway or alley with any other public streets or highways, or at an intersection of public streets or highways, is not permitted. It is also unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to park or camp in any trailer or recreational vehicle at any time on any street in the Town of Speedway.

It should also be noted that it is unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to charge a fee of any type for access to or the right to park on any public street, thoroughfare, alley or roadway in the Town of Speedway.

Also, keep in mind that **should the Race be delayed or postponed, it may become necessary to enforce parking restrictions beyond these times.**

Motorists and residents are cautioned that those in violation of parking restrictions during these time periods shall be subject to a \$50.00 fine plus towing and storage fees.

## GEORGETOWN ROAD AND 16<sup>TH</sup> STREET CLOSED TO VEHICLES DURING THIS YEAR'S RUNNING OF THE BRICKYARD 400

As in years past, the Speedway Police Department will be closing Georgetown Road and 16<sup>th</sup> Street to all vehicular traffic during this year's running of the Brickyard 400 on Sunday, September 9, 2018, or on Monday, September 10, 2018, should the race be postponed due to weather.

In an effort to increase the safety and security of race patrons, Georgetown Road will be closed south of 25th Street beginning at 11:00 AM race morning to all vehicular traffic. After Georgetown Road is closed, no vehicular traffic, including placarded traffic, will be allowed to access the road. Those race patrons with placards who are accustomed to entering IMS Gate 7 will have to enter through Gate 2 (W. 16<sup>th</sup> Street) or Gate 10 (30<sup>th</sup> Street). Local residents who reside on this stretch of Georgetown Road are encouraged to make provisions for this temporary traffic restriction as vehicles will not be permitted to access Georgetown Road from McCray Street, 24<sup>th</sup> Street, and all other access points in this area. Upon completion of the race, Georgetown Road will remain closed to vehicular traffic until the vast majority of race pedestrian foot traffic clears from the roadway (approximately 1 hour after the race).

Sixteenth (16<sup>th</sup>) Street will also be closed during the running of this year's Brickyard 400 between Olin Avenue on the east to the 16<sup>th</sup> Street Roundabout on the west from approximately 1:30 PM until the end of the race. In addition, 16<sup>th</sup> Street will not be accessible from Polco Street, as it will be blocked at 10<sup>th</sup> Street.

Traffic traveling east on Crawfordsville Road from the west will be turned around at the 16<sup>th</sup> Street Roundabout. Traffic traveling west on 16<sup>th</sup> Street from downtown will be diverted south on Olin Avenue.

These road closure restrictions and additional security measures are being established to ensure the safety of our residents, businesses and visitors during and after the race. The Speedway Police Department appreciates everyone's cooperation during these temporary restrictions and apologizes for any inconvenience they may cause.

Residents are reminded that these restrictions are for race day only, Sunday, September 9, 2018. **Keep in mind that should there be a rain out of the Brickyard 400, it may become necessary to impose these same restrictions the following day.**

## 2018 BRICYARD 400 MAIN STREET PARKING RESTRICTIONS

The Brickyard 400 is coming to Speedway on September 7, 8 and 9, 2018. Residents are reminded of the Main Street parking restrictions that the Speedway Police Department will enforce during this event.

Practice and qualification days are scheduled for Friday, September 7; and Saturday, September 8; with the Lilly Diabetes 250 Race scheduled for Saturday, September 8, and the Brickyard 400 scheduled for Sunday, September 9. Therefore, some parking restrictions will occur on Main Street during this time period.

During the race weekend three (3) hour parking will be allowed on both sides of Main Street between 10<sup>th</sup> Street and 16<sup>th</sup> Street from Friday, September 7, starting at 12:00 AM until Saturday, September 8, at 11:59 PM. **However, a special event will be held on Friday, September 7, when the NASCAR Monster Energy Series Haulers arrive for the race weekend. The Haulers will be on display for the public's viewing from approximately 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM, from 10<sup>th</sup> Street to 16<sup>th</sup> Street. To accommodate this event, Main Street will be closed on Friday, September 7, from 10<sup>th</sup> Street to 16<sup>th</sup> Street beginning at 3:00 PM until approximately 8:30 PM or until all vendors and pedestrians have been cleared from the area.**

**No parking will be allowed on Main Street on Friday, September 7, from 10<sup>th</sup> Street to 16<sup>th</sup> Street from 8:00 AM until the street is reopened for traffic. There will be no parking in this area from 8:00 AM until 8:30 PM or until the end of the event.**

**THERE SHALL BE NO PARKING ON MAIN STREET BETWEEN 10<sup>TH</sup> STREET AND 16<sup>TH</sup> STREET ON RACE DAY, SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 9, STARTING AT 12:00 AM. IF THE RACE IS POSTPONED, THE NO PARKING RESTRICTION WILL BE IN EFFECT THROUGH MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 10, 2018. IN ADDITION, THERE SHALL BE NO PARKING ON GILMAN STREET OR ALLISON WAY DURING THIS SAME TIME PERIOD ON SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 9, 2018.**

## **RACE DAY TRAFFIC RESTRICTION REMINDER TO SPEEDWAY RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES**

The Speedway Police Department would like to remind ALL Speedway residents and businesses to be aware of the traffic patterns that are established just prior to the end of the Brickyard 400, on Sunday, September 9, 2018. The traffic restrictions take effect at lap 150 of the race. This, of course, does not include the possibility of the race being called to an early end due to weather concerns. If the race is postponed until Monday, September 10, 2018, these same traffic patterns will be in effect.

Generally as a rule, at lap 150 surrounding area roadways are restricted to facilitate maximum movement of vehicular traffic out of the Town of Speedway. It is recommended that Speedway residents prepare for this traffic outflow with regard to their personal business and travel to and from the Town of Speedway. Once the roadways fill with exiting traffic it will be extremely difficult to get in and out of the Town until the traffic has left the area.

Due to the large amount of spectators and vehicles leaving this event, it takes approximately two hours to clear our streets after the race. While this poses a degree of inconvenience to some people, moving this huge amount of traffic out of the town in this amount of time is an amazing accomplishment.

All of the officers from the Speedway Police Department, the Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department, the Marion County Sheriff's Office and the Indiana State Police work very hard to ensure that the temporary traffic restrictions are managed in the most efficient way possible. The Speedway Police Department appreciates the patience, consideration and cooperation from all town residents and business owners during this time.
